3 WON, 3 LOST, 3 DRAWN.

After an unsuccessful June and a successful July, August was an indifferent month for results although we again kept the statistics tidy by winning three, losing three and drawing three. So now with three games remaining our playing record is P 29, W 10, D 7, L 12.

We opened the month with a draw against Potters Bar Crusaders at Brunswick Park. 'Crusaders batted on after tea to declare at 143-6 and then Arkley slumped to 71-6 (Sharma 40) before Peter Brown and Bob Ingram (34 each) took us to within ten runs of victory in a rousing finish. The following day our total of 127 on a good batting wicket at Oakhill Park against Roving Reporters was beaten with two wickets to spare by the Reporters for whom Rob Hunt hit a 'cavalier' 67. In a C.C.C. Fixture Bureau game the next week we were soundly beaten by a strong Essendon side at their beautiful country setting. Our first victory of the month came against Agricola at Parliament Hill the next day with Sharma scoring 41 and taking 6-23. Having beaten Bentley Heath II at Brunswick already this season we suffered a reverse when we lost a specially arranged fixture with them again at Brunswick. Our score of 96-8 dec in over $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours was passed by Bentley Heath with 5 overs to spare despite losing early wickets. Mark Cripps and Bob Ingram combined to dismiss Watford Taverners for 111 with some irresponsible batting from the early batsmen. Arkley made the runs for the loss of just four wickets with all the batsmen making double figures and Peter Amass hitting the winning runs with a boundary! St. Peters middle order batsmen helped them to a score of 158 after being 12-3 (Colin Johnson 2-6!). Arkley finished at 112-6 after getting bogged down in the later stages. Mitton, Butler and Priest could not raise a side for the intended match the following day and so we were paired with Old Columbans in another C.C.C. Fixture Bureau game. Old Columbans (from London Colney) declared at tea with 162-7 after a fast start. Arkley led by Mark Cripps (88) who put on 92 with Peter Brown (31) scored their highest ever score batting second to win the match by 4 wickets despite a few 'hiccups' in the later stages. Continuing where we left off against Old Columbans we made 179-5 declared against Waltham Abbey Royal British Legion with nearly six players making the 'Barnet Press'. Waltham Abbey R.B.L. finished with 164-7 thanks to numerous dropped catches.

Peter Brown won the 1975 Single Wicket Competition at Brunswick Park on Saturday 30th August beating Clive Townsend in the final by 15 runs and a wicket. Peter had a bye in the first round but then went on to beat brother Colin Brown and Sharma to reach the final. Clive beat his brother Paul, Arthur Johnson and John Griffiths to reach the final. Fourteen players took part in the competition in which 488 runs were scored from 353 balls with thirteen sixes. Sharma took his 50th wicket of the season when he bowled J.Morgan, bowled his 100th recorded maiden and scored his 300th recorded four.* R. Jeffery of Agricola has now batted 207 minutes against us (4 innings) in scoring 28 runs.* Bejay Andrews (ducks a speciality) batted at number 11 for the first time for Arkley (and about time too!).* Esteemed Spectators at this match, Mr. and Mrs. Amass. Did you notice how much better Mr. Amass's language was.!* We have now won five out five games v. Agricola scoring 646 runs and conceding 315. Arkley have used 18 different players in these five games whilst Agricola have used 32! This 48 run victory was the closest margin between the two teams as the other victories have been by 126runs, 66runs, 88runs and 8 wickets.* This was probably the first game played by Arkley in which the G.P.O. Tower and St. Pauls Cathedral could be seen from the ground!
