

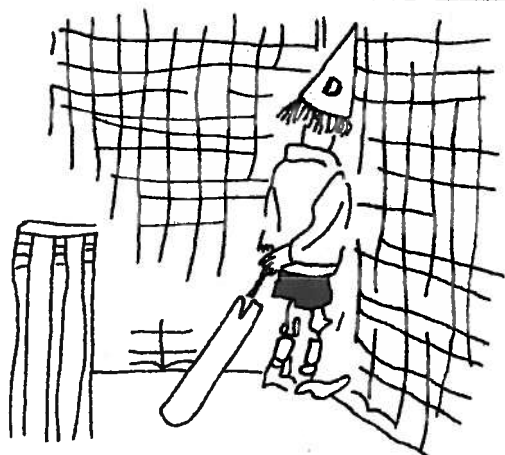

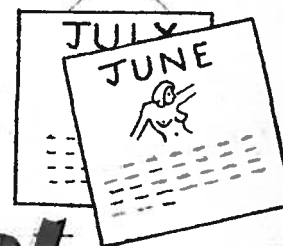

A Month To Forget

JUNE 1975 is a month Arkley Cricket Club can well forget as out of ten games played only one was won and two drawn. The one victory was a handsome 56 run victory over New Southgate Social in the first round of the Embassy Cup and we were unfortunate to lose to Bow by 2 runs in the next round of the competition. The other six defeats however were by fairly large margins.

We started the month losing to W.A.R.B.L. in a low scoring game (as usual) on ^{the} 'Lunar Landscape' surface at Upshire Hall, this despite a hat trick by 'No I'm not buying a round' Bob Ingram. The following week we lost to Reg Olivera by 50 runs, dropped catches and poor fielding probably being the main factor in this defeat. Our bowling and fielding was unrecognisable in comparison the next day when we dismissed New Southgate Social for 87 to defeat them by 56 runs in the Embassy Cup. 56 was also the number of runs scored by both Sharma and Peter Brown as they put on 98 runs for our third wicket to make victory possible. A too strong Old Elizabethan's III side scored 193 in just over 2 hours and then dismissed Arkley for 75 in a C.C.C. Fixture Bureau game. Watford Taverners the following day nearly matched the Old Elizabeth's score when they declared. Arkley looked to be heading for another defeat before an injured Arthur Brown, Paul Townsend, Bob Ingram and 34 byes pulled Arkley round to make a good show of it in the end. After restricting Northmet to 76-8 in a twenty overs game we could only muster 43-7 ourselves against the bowling of King, Johnson, Horn & Cant. Bob Ingram and (a rather bruised) Peter Amass turned a near defeat into a near victory v. Roving Reporters in our first game at Brunswick Park. Against a 'rabble' from Bow the next day in the Embassy Cup we lost by 2 runs after a stand of 72 by Arthur Brown and Bob Ingram from 59-6 looked as if it might win us the game. A modest total of 125-6 v. Manor Drive M. at the unlikely venue of Kenton Cricket Club was easily passed as opener Mike Farrell hit 50 in 25 minutes (28 balls) and opener J. Baughan of British Rail Hatfield hit 61 out of 117 as the railwaymen beat us by 31 runs to complete this unsuccessful month. MORE DETAILS INSIDE

This was NOT Old Elizabethan's third eleven but a mixture of firsts and seconds called the third eleven! Another mixed side of 1sts and 2nds were playing Old Elizabethan's School the same afternoon. The game was arranged through the C.C.C. Emergency Fixture Bureau.* C.Winchester was Colin Johnson's head teacher at Ashmole school.* Sharma took his 200th recorded wicket when he dismissed M.Rossington.* Arthur Brown equalled his own record of 4 dismissals (1ct,3st) in a match.* Colin Johnson (11), Peter Amass (6) and Paul Townsend (17) made their highest ever scores for Arkley.* Peter Amass took his first Arkley catch.* R.Jones bowled left and right handed during the final stages.* Bob Ingram was dropped twice before being out for the first time this season after seven innings, his average is now 29.00.* There was no Arkley 12th Man for this game but Arthur Johnson turned up later and umpired for a spell, it was he in fact who gave Bob Ingram out lbw!* Esteemed spectator at this match was Margaret Spilsted, Helen's younger sister.* Jon Davies ended his run of 5 consecutive ducks. We learned later that the one run he is credited with for this innings should have been signalled as a leg bye!
